

Parish Mission Action Plan

In response to the Bishop's challenge to the Diocese a small planning group has been looking at ways our Parish might develop a Mission Action Plan.

Beginning with the Vision that we might be a local area where the love of God is proclaimed to all people, they suggest a number of elements needed to fulfil our Mission.

These might be grouped under four headings:

GROWING:

Prayer groups, study groups, baptism & confirmation preparation, retreats, quiet days, Centre of Spirituality, training for ministry

RESOURCING:

Communication, newsletters. website, facebook, meeting-places, church buildings, liturgical and teaching materials

WORSHIPPING:

Sunday Eucharist, weekday services, Nursing homes, house groups, special services

CARING:

Pastoral care, hospital visiting, schools' programmes, bookshop, Care & Share, community celebrations
